MIGHTY WARRIORS - DRESSED FOR BATTLE



What an amazing God-filled, God-blessed, God-glorified week we have just had! Most of you know of the extreme challenges we have faced in H2H over the last 2 months. Last August, I felt an urgency to contact long-time friend Bruce Van Natta to come this year to do seminars about his book, "A Miraculous Life", for our 9th-12th grade students and our staff. Little did I know what lay ahead in the months preceding his visit, when our Amy went home to Jesus, and the aftermath of sorrow and grief we are all suffering with that. But God's timing is perfect.

Luke 4:18 : "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, to proclaim FREEDOM for the prisoners, and set the oppressed free."

Bruce and his wife Lori, Gerald and Deb Palmer, and Mike and LeAnne Gunderson arrived in Honduras February 15th, full of the Holy Spirit and weaponed-up to go to war for us, and did not stop until they departed for home a week later. They ministered prayer, healing and comfort to over 200 that included our teens, our children at the village, and our church family, - and that was just in the first two days they were here over the weekend.

From Monday through Thursday, those same Holy Spirit-filled prayers, healings, comfort, and teachings were given to approximately 4500 people in 5 schools, the Puerto Cortes Prison, and the Thursday night crusade at our Bilingual School. Many asked Jesus into their hearts and many were delivered from sickness both spiritual and physical within our H2H family, our H2H school staffs and 9th -12th graders, at Franklin, Atlantic, and Cuyamel Schools, at the Puerto Cortes Prison, and at the public Crusade Thursday with over 300 in attendance and 200 decisions for Jesus just that night! God was glorified!

In the seminars, we were taught about the 5 Giants we all face in life; Physical, Emotional, Relational, Spiritual and Financial. We were given the 5 Weapons for these battles; The Word, Praise, Authority, Prayer and Faith, and were taught how to use them. A theme that ran through each group we prayed for was anger, hatred and unforgiveness for hurts that had been done to those who came forward for prayer by someone in their past. We learned we had to quit hating, to stop being angry, and to forgive those who had hurt us before God could answer the prayers we were praying. As individuals did just that, God performed miracle after miracle, physically, spiritually, emotionally, and in relationships. One was the restoration of sight for one of our daughters in her eye, that was declared blind just two months ago by our visiting optometry team from Oregon.

Words of knowledge were given to the team as they prayed for individuals that they could not possibly have known prior to praying. One young man at Franklin High School came to Mike and me about his heart. He told us it felt physically cold. He thought something was physically wrong with his heart and wanted us to pray for God to heal it. As we prayed, Mike received a Word of Knowledge from God that this young man had an uncle who had hurt him in the past. Immediately, the young man’s hands flew to cover his mouth and he burst out crying. Mike led him in a prayer to rid his heart of the anger, hate and unforgiveness toward his uncle, and immediately, his heart no longer felt physically cold. He wept for a long time in Mike’s arms.

One of our teachers, Miss Nancy, came forward for prayer about pain in her back and her leg. Bruce had her sit and extend her legs. One was remarkably shorter than the other. As he prayed, we watched in fascination as her short leg grew to match her other leg, which she said she actually could feel. Her back pain was totally gone.

One of our school directors had been suffering with a medical condition that her doctor said would need surgery. She had received the infilling of the Holy Spirit last week. Monday, she went for a check up before scheduling the surgery, and the doctor said he could not figure it out, but the condition is totally gone!!! She is healed!! No surgery necessary!!!

All of us in our H2H Family have been suffering with sorrow at the loss of our Mami Amy. Healing hands of comfort were laid on all of us by this God-sent team to help ease our pain. In the process of us getting to minister Jesus to so many, God is giving us His strength and His healing for our hearts.

Every service, all week, was led by our H2H Worship Team. This is a team of students and adults from our bilingual school and our church that was organized by Amy and Oscar in November to lead worship at our school events and to visit other schools and organizations to share the Gospel. Amy led the singers and Oscar sang, played guitar, and directed it all. They first performed at our school Christmas Program, and at our church Christmas dinner celebration, just days before Amy went home to be with Jesus.

Now, led by Oscar, they are carrying on and opened each program during the week with musical praise and prayer filled with the Word. It was amazing!
