Quinceañera 2022

Fifteen of our US H2H family came to celebrate with them – Gary and Sylvia Thacker and team members from Virginia and Texas: Mackenzie Bolen, Bill Canady, Cailin Drain, Ali LeGrand, Dave LeGrand, Alan Lambert, and Tami Myers; Dave Bachelor and Phil Jasa from Centralia; Kurt and Helen Frenter from Texas; and Pastors Scott and Jeannie Collins from Chehalis. I wish all of you could have experienced this amazing celebration, which is planned and executed by our board member Rick Stephens each year, that honors our daughters, God's beloved Princesses. It is difficult to describe, but I will try!





For those of you new to the ministry, in Latin American Culture, a Quinceañera is a coming-of-age celebration for a girl who is having her 15th birthday. It is a combination of the Spanish words quince "fifteen" and $a\tilde{n}os$ "years". It is customary to celebrate this event in a very lavish manner. It is somewhat like a 16^{th} birthday for girls in the US.

Several years ago, one of our girls was asked what she wanted for her 15th birthday. Her response, "I wish I could have a Quinceañera, but I know that is not possible." So, we began having Quinceañera celebrations once a year for all our girls who turned 15 that year.

The planning begins early in the year, with each honored girl choosing the pattern and material for her gown and visiting our seamstress. In the spring, the first fitting happens and by September the girls have their final gown fitting; and the finishing touches are completed by buying high heels, jewelry, and hair decorations.

Prior to the this November Quinceañera, Tio Rick, who is the director of all things Quinceañera for our ministry, works diligently to finalize every detail. He arranges for our gym at the Bilingual School to be transformed by professional decorators into a lavish wonderland, complete with red carpet, entrance arches, columns, flowers, and a picture background for photos with family and friends afterwards. Tio Rick orders the chairs for guests, the special cake and drinks, purchases the

Quinceañera Crowns, the heart lockets with Amy and Oscar's pictures inside, and a Bible for each "Princess" with their names engraved on the cover; which are presented to each girl as part of the ceremony. In the midst of all the preparation, Tio Rick schedules a special day to commemorate this celebration by "capturing the moment" with pictures. Tio Rick and an army of hairdressers and helpers, take the girls in their gowns to beautiful locations for pictures, including the historic Fort in Omoa and the beaches there. The day before the Quinceañera is rehearsal day including all those who will be part of the celebration



On the day of Quinceañera, the girls get up early to begin the primping and pampering every Quinceañera requires – pedicure, manicure, hair, and makeup. And then they all go to the "waiting room" at the school to put on their gowns and wait for the knock that tells them it is their turn to take the arm of their escort for the procession through the arch, down the aisle and up the staircase to their place on the stage for the ceremony to begin.

After each girl is on stage, the program begins with our H2H Worship team, led by Tio Oscar with everyone worshiping. Then comes the speeches about each girl, the presentation of the Bibles, the crowns, and the necklaces, and it ends with prayer. Finally, each one, arm in arm with their escort, is led down the stairs, and the red carpet to the picture location. As pictures are taken, the guests are served Quinceañera cake and refreshments, and everyone joins the girls for congratulations and lots of photos!

After everyone leaves, all the honored girls are treated to a delicious dinner at our home, along with their guests, about 50 altogether. It is a blessed time for all of us, and one we look forward to each year as our daughters grow up.

Each month we are short the funds needed to accomplish everything we do, from the school fees and teachers' pay, to the children's' homes and all the needs there. Would you consider making a gift to the ministry to help meet all the needs?

We need funds to pay the school expenses for all 50 children under our care still in the Bilingual School. Even though they have partial scholarships, it still requires \$1000 per child per year for them to attend our school. Please prayerfully consider helping with this.

Change In Gift Policy To Rescue More Kids

Finances in a charity operation are always tight and now that the Honduran government is going to allow us to start taking in more kids, we have been looking at ways to change our spending, so we have more funds to care for more children.

When it comes to giving birthday presents the ministry uses operating funds to purchase the bulk of the presents for the kids, which is very expensive to do. Along with the cost of the actual gifts, we incur shipping charges to send gifts to Honduras. Effective immediately, at each birthday celebration only children 12 years of age and younger will receive a birthday gift. Those who are over 12 years of age will still be celebrated sang to, prayed over and served cake. Also, rather than give a full set of clothes in addition to a toy in the gifts at the birthday celebration, we will distribute the clothes to kids as their needs arise.

For Christmas each kid regardless of their age will receive a gift and an outfit. As we are in a transition of implementing the new policy, the gifts and clothes we received or purchased for kids over the age of 12 who celebrate their birthday in the 3rd or 4th quarter will receive those gifts for Christmas.

Thank you for supporting our efforts to teach the kids under our care proper values and to also provide the ability to rescue more children from the desperate circumstances many of them are living in.
