Christmas/New Year's Visit from Daniel

Our Daniel Manzanarez is now in his 3rd year at Moody Bible Institute in Spokane studying to become a missionary pilot. He was among the first 5 boys to come to our family 19 years ago. Thank you to everyone who supports H2H, including this amazing young man. Because of your faithful prayers and support, he is already paying it forward. Here are some edited excerpts from his recent update letter about his adventures! He helped us at Amy's Garden while he was here over Christmas. As you will see, God is already using him for His purposes to help those in need.



In December, I had the opportunity to make a trip to Honduras in my reliable Toyota. The trip went well, and I had a lot of fun driving there. I learned that when it comes to dealing with customs, patience is key, as I crossed three borders: Mexico, Guatemala, and Honduras. One of the things that I pondered was the topic of poverty, as I was seeing a lot of need. Galatians 6:2 says, "Carry one another's burdens; in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." In Guatemala, I saw a man about 40 years old with a box of gum he was trying to sell on the street to make money for his family. When I was a kid, there was a time I used to sell gum on the street, too. Believe me, there is not a lot of profit from doing that; just enough to stock the box for the next day and some leftovers for a bit of food. I decided to pull over to ask the man about how much he had sold. He sadly said "Nothing," and it was already getting dark. I asked him if he had eaten yet. He said "no." There was a gas station nearby, so I asked him to come with me for some food. There were only hot dogs and sodas, so I asked him if he was ok with that. His reply was, "If you buy one of those, can I take it to my family, because I'd rather have them eat than me." He said three kids and his wife lived in his house. I ordered hot dogs for all of them. As they were preparing the hot dogs, he mentioned that his wife is sick and needed some medicine. I left the man with what money I had for the medicine. An hour later my brother called, and as I described to him what had just happened, I started crying. I knew that God had a purpose for why He allowed me to meet this man.

In Honduras, I talked with a dear brother in Christ whose house needed a roof, and he had no money to make it happen. I prayed about it and sent an email to my friend and pastor in Spokane for some prayer, too. In 3 hours from writing that email, we were getting the money to buy the roof for this dear brother. When I arrived at his house, the roof wasn't the only thing needed. Concrete blocks were needed because the walls were not finished. Wood was needed and many other materials. I was able to contact a friend to get some more money to do at least a "complete" half of his little house. I am thankful to God and to those who made this possible.

As of right now, apart from school, I see my purpose as the one who passes the needs of my brothers and sisters in Christ to the people who are willing and able to help.

*I have completed the Airframe & Powerplant program at Moody. A&P licenses are the two **Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) certificates required to become an aviation maintenance technician.** In order to perform maintenance, repairs, or tests on an aircraft, these certain certifications must be earned first. In February, I will start flying. I am super excited and super nervous because these following months will be the most intense of the whole program. Please keep me in your prayers as I start learning almost a new language when communicating with air traffic control.*

Thank you for your prayers on my behalf. I continue to pray for God's guidance as to what my purpose is, how that will look, and how I can best serve those in need.
